

SUPPLEMENTAL SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

For

JY-15, 420 LASER/LASER RADIAL & SUNFISH OPEN CLASS BOATS

The sailing instructions for the BYC Fourth of July Invitation Regatta are applicable, except as modified by these Supplemental Instructions. A skippers' meeting for JY-15s, 420's, Sunfish Open and Lasers will be held Saturday at 9:00 AM. The JY-15/420/Laser/Sunfish Open course will be located East of the Babylon Yacht Club. All participants must wear life jackets while racing.

RACE SCHEDULE

As many races as possible will be held, with the first races starting as follows:

Sat	5 th JULY	10 AM	(On the water lunch, sign up for lunch at registration)
Sun	6 th JULY	11 AM	

Subsequent races each day will start as soon as possible after the last boat finishes the preceding race (except for a lunch break).

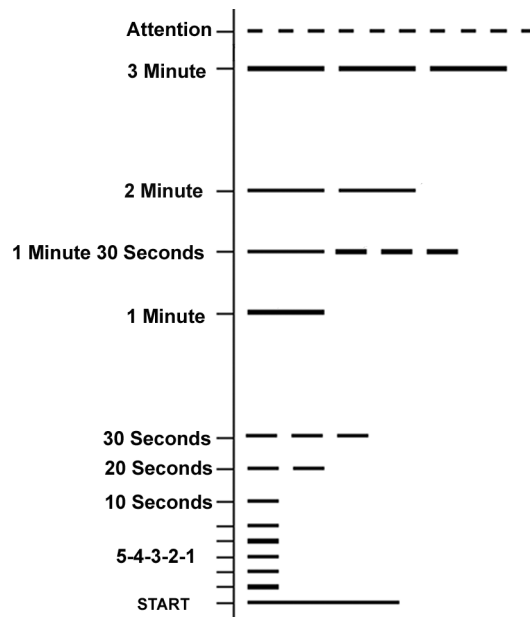
SCORING

The Low Point System of Appendix A of the racing rules will apply. One excluded score will be allowed for each 6 races sailed, and will be computed based on the total number of races sailed for the regatta. One race constitutes a series. The first three races sailed will count toward the season championships.

STARTING SEQUENCE

Start rotation will be JY-15, 420, Laser and Sunfish Open classes. Changes may be announced on the water.

A horn will be used to start each class. A series of short blasts may be made before the starting sequence begins. Signals will be timed from their commencement as follows:



START & FINISH

The start and finish will be between an orange flag on the committee boat and an orange inflatable starting mark.

An anti-barging mark may be placed astern of the committee boat. If this mark is used, it does not alter the starting line but boats may not touch it or pass between it and the committee boat at any time. Touching the mark or passing between it and the committee boat can be corrected by doing a 360° turn at the first reasonable opportunity.

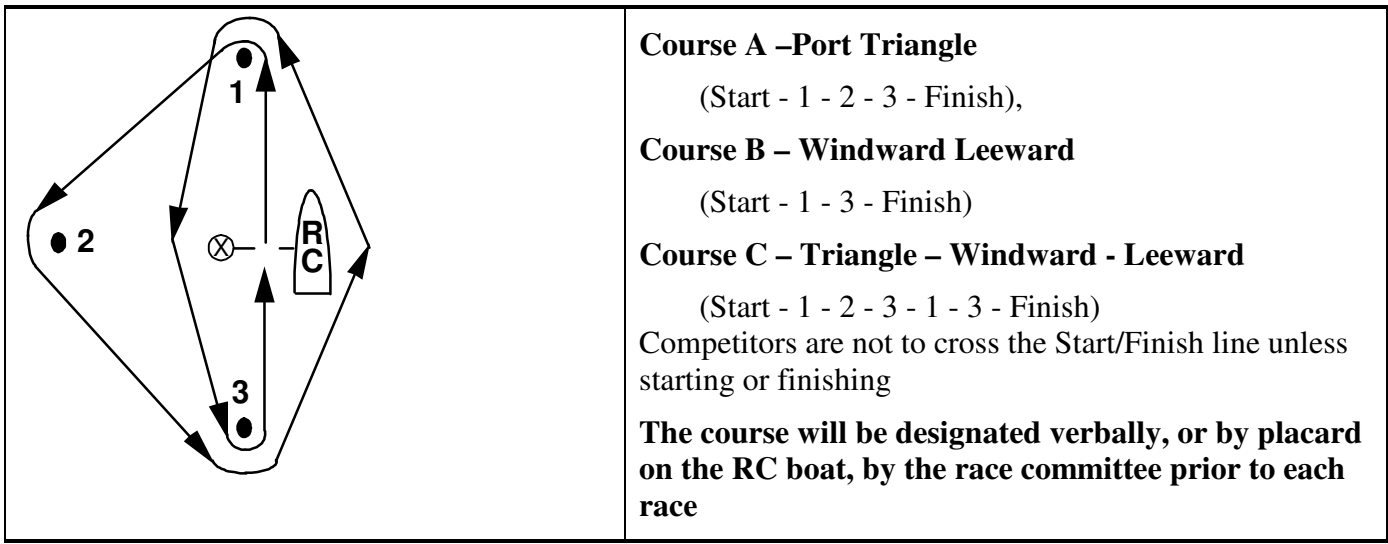
Competitors are not to cross the Start/Finish line unless starting or finishing

MARKS

Marks will be yellow inflated buoys.

COURSE INSTRUCTIONS

The courses will be port triangle, windward-leeward, or some combination thereof. The course will be designated verbally, or by placard on the RC boat, by the race committee prior to each race.



RECALLS

Individual recalls will be signaled by one sound signal and the race committee will attempt to hail the sail number(s) of any recalled boats. Failure to hear or heed a recall does not relieve a boat of her obligation to start correctly.

A general recall will be signaled by two sound signals. The starting sequence will be resumed as soon as possible after the general recall.

RACE COMMITTEE SIGNALS

Changes to these instructions may be made by the race committee orally on the water or by posting a notice on the Regatta Notice Board located on the BYC porch.

POSTPONEMENTS

Postponements will be made orally.
